<u>Alumni Spotlight</u>

Paul Condry, Sportswriter, Broadcaster, Author of "Once a Brickie, Always a Brickie: The History of Hobart Football"

What is your current occupation, and what do you do?

I live in Mishawaka, Indiana. I am the founder/owner of the Regional Radio Sports Network and the Indiana Football Digest. In short, I am a Sportscaster, Sportswriter, Publisher and Business owner.

Could you describe your life and career path from Hobart High School until now?

That would take forever. I graduated Hobart High School in 1974. I coached in the Hobart schools system in the early 80's, and in the mid 80's got into the media.

I have self-taught myself in nearly every aspect of my life. That is why my mentors and coaches have played a vital role in my success.

I can tell you this: I was the first sportscaster from northwest Indiana to be inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Hall of Fame. In addition, I am the first "caster" to win the most prestigious award in sportscasting, the National Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (NSSA) "Indiana Sportscaster of the Year". I have received the NSSA award four times and have been a finalist I think 12 or 13 times.

When you receive awards like I have that have been voted on by your peers it's pretty awesome.

Tell us about your new book, "Once a Brickie, Always a Brickie". How did you decide to write it?

"Once A Brickie, Always A Brickie: The History of Hobart Football" was something I have been working on really since I was high school. It really started to pick up steam, when I sat down with Tom Kerr, Jerry Hicks and Ryan Turley and shared my "vision" of how we could do it. After that meeting, I was fortunate to sit down with Dr. Buffington (Superintendent) Bob Glover (AD), Brent Martinson (Principal), coaches Kerr, Hicks and Turley along with my staff and we developed a game plan on how we should proceed.

After a year of planning, the School City of Hobart and HHS Football Booster Club commissioned my team to write the book. Just as an artist would be hired to paint a mural on a wall, or a sculptor to craft a statue, we have been commissioned to write a very important part of the history of HHS and the Hobart community.

I am taking NO royalties from this project whatsoever. Our company is getting paid to write it, but I felt it was important to give back to my school and community that helped influence my life in wide variety of ways.



Is there also a documentary film that goes with the book?

That is in the works; we are working on four projects simultaneously. The release of the documentary video

will be part of the overall project: "Once A Brickie, Always A Brickie: The History of Hobart Football".

Will we be able to order the book at the HHS Alumni Association dinner on May 22?

Still working out those details. I will have more info on our "Once A Brickie, Always A Brickie: The History of Hobart Football" Facebook page, and of course the Hobart football website, http://www.hobartbrickiefootball.com/.

Were there any people, places or incidents in Hobart that had a special influence on your life and career?

I have been involved in sports all my life. Several HHS coaches/teachers over the years have left a profound impact on life. I would say that Tom Kerr, Tom Workman, Jim Herrick, Jim Litke, Jim Lichtenberger, Frank Kurth, Mo Rhody and Don Howell were encouraging and influential during my formative years.

In addition, Dick Gross and Stew Mattix were great influences in my life, during my time elementary school days at George Earle Elementary School.

When I went into coaching at Hobart Middle School, they were even greater of an influence. I would also say that watching guys like Steve Balash, Jerry Hicks, Don Rogers, Bill Cope, John Carlson, Doug James, Bob Glover over the years have shaped me as coach and as a leader from the Hobart community.

I also have been heavily influenced by other coaches and business owners from many other communities.

What advice would you give to Hobart High School students about sports broadcasting and writing?

First and foremost, if you're lazy and take shortcuts, find another profession. It takes a tremendous amount of time, energy and commitment to be a good sportscaster and sportswriter. If you want to be GREAT at this profession, you have to be thick-skinned and you must be able to take constructive criticism from your peers, fans, coaches etc. In the beginning the pay is not very good either! LOL! Secondly, I look at my profession not as job, but as an artist looks at his canvas. You have to develop your "craft" to be successful.

In addition, you also have a tremendous responsibility to tell the truth. That is the problem we have today with our main-stream media. I could write a book on how BAD the mainstream has abused its place in the world today. It has unfortunately, crept over into sports journalism as well.

- To support educational programs through teacher grants and student scholarships


Our Supporters
