## Sam and Wilma Preissler, '53 Hobart Brickies, Married 60 Years

Sam Preissler and Wilma Hasse graduated from Hobart High School in 1953. They were married in December 1957 and have just celebrated their 60<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. They were featured in a recent issue of the <u>"Current in Carmel" newspaper</u>.

Sam and Wilma share their memories with us in our *Alumni Spotlight*.

Where do you live now, and what have you been up to lately?

In 2012, we sold our first home, here in Indianapolis, where we had lived for 43 years. In 2014, we moved into a new Senior Retirement Community, called The Barrington of Carmel (Indiana).

Currently, we are very active in the Barrington's Masterpiece Living Process. This process is devoted to promoting "successful aging", in (4) main areas, social, intellectual, physical and spiritual. This activity keeps us going strong in all (4) areas. In December, 2017, we celebrated our 60th wedding anniversary by taking a three week cruise throughout the Caribbean Sea.

How and when did you meet, and what happened between high school and when you got married?

We met in the fall of 1951. Wilma had transferred from Horace Mann high school in Gary, Indiana that year. We "just happened" to have lockers across the aisle from each other. Sam offered to carry her books from class to class. After graduation in 1953, Wilma entered nursing school in Chicago, Illinois. This school was a nationally accredited by the National League of Nursing, and that held many benefits as compared to a state accredited school. Also, all courses were given college credit through the University of Illinois. During this first year in nurses training, Sam came every weekend to Chicago, and we would go out to dinner in

the "Loop" and take in a movie and stage show at the Chicago Theater.

After graduating from nursing school in May of 1956, where Wilma earned her Registered Nurse degree, she was employed by the Santa Fe Railroad as a Courier Nurse, traveling to California and Texas three times a month. Many exciting times were spent meeting many celebrities from Hollywood, sewing a button on Frank Sinatra's

sport coat, and even having a dessert with President and Mrs. Eisenhower. In November, 1954, Sam enlisted in the Army. He spent time in Germany and Italy. This enlistment assured him of the G.I Bill benefit. His three year enlistment was over in October, 1957.

Sam, how did you propose, and where and when did you get married?

I proposed on Halloween night, October 31, 1957, just three weeks after returning home from the Army. Wilma and I were taking her small nieces and nephew, "trick or treating". After her sister's family returned to their home, I proposed. At first, Wilma thought I was just joking, but quickly realized my sincerity. Wilma had always wanted to be a "Christmas Bride", so we were married on December 21st, 1957 at Hobart's First Baptist Church. After a brief honeymoon, we settled into a small apartment at 626 Main Street in Hobart. Sam worked at Indiana Laminated Wall, a drywall company. In May of 1958, we moved to Valparaiso where Wilma worked for Dr. James Brown, who had his medical practice in the Farmer's State Bank building, on the square.

What kind of jobs and careers did you have over the years?

Sam was slow to get on board the "Education Train", but in 1958, five years after graduating from Hobart High School, he enrolled in Valparaiso University, then transferred to I. U. Northwest in Gary in 1959, and on to I. U. Bloomington in 1960, graduating in January

1962. By this time in August of 1960, they welcomed their first son, Scott, into the family. After a short 18 months in retail management, Sam transferred to the automotive industry. Cars were Sam's second love, and he joined Ford Motor Company in 1963, in Indianapolis. Sam spent a total of 32 years between wholesale sales to dealers and then in manufacturing management. Wilma spent eight years at home with our preschool sons, born in 1960 and 1963. When it was time for the boys to go to school, Wilma went with them, becoming the school nurse at Heritage Christian School for 20 years, retiring in 1986.

Tell us about your children and their families.

We have two sons, and five grandchildren. Our eldest son, Scott, has a PHD in ministry, and lives in Georgia with his family. Scott also married his high school sweetheart. Our younger son, Christopher, graduated from LeTourneau University in Longview, Texas, with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. Christopher and his family live near us in Fishers, Indiana. Our grandchildren are at the age where they are branching out on their own.

Were there any teachers or experiences in the Hobart school system that you particularly remember, or that especially interested you?

For Sam. the fondest memories of Hobart High School are all wrapped up with the HHS band, where he played alto saxophone. In the 1950's, both the concert band and the marching band were ranked as one of the best in the country. The band never placed below first place in any contest. Sam also participated in local and state Solo and Ensemble contests. The annual "Band Tours" went to such places as New York City, and throughout the south, down to Florida. These were outstanding events for a bunch of kids of

the "50's" that had not traveled much. Only a band with Hobart's reputation could gain invitations to perform across the country.

Do you have any advice for high school students today, or for adults, about having a happy marriage?

It is important that you strive to complete your higher education before marriage. It is also important that you understand your likes and more importantly your dislikes. Make it a priority to communicate openly and honestly. Trust and fidelity in and to each other produces a lasting and happy marriage. Sharing a deep commitment to your faith is essential.

#### THE OLD HOBART MILL, from the 1918 HHS Aurora Yearbook

Anyone who studies the history of Hobart knows about the Old Hobart Mill, built in 1846 and 1847 by Hobart founder George Earle, and destroyed by fire in 1953. The Northwest Indiana Times ran a special feature on the mill in 1997 (Hobart's Sesquicentennial), with information provided by Elin and Dorothy Ballantyne of the Hobart Historical Society. The article also discusses the brickyards, and the Strand and Art Theaters.
