
Map to the Hobart VFW

Michael Grdgon, Decorated Vietnam Veteran, Now Helping Other Veterans

Our spotlight this issue is on Michael Grdgon, HHS Class of 1965. Michael appeared in the <u>September 2019 issue of *The Brick & Mortar Board*</u> after receiving a Congressional Veteran Commendation at the Texas State Capitol. Our interview begins here.

What are you doing these days?

I am currently retired from my occupation and I am a Veterans Advocate and aid in helping Veterans with their disability claims.

Alumni Spotlight (cont.)

Can you describe the path from Hobart High School to where you are today?

The path from Hobart High School was difficult. When I graduated, I didn't have any certain career path that I knew I was certain to follow. In 1966, when I was drafted into the Military, I knew my life would change. The discipline that I learned in the Military and from Combat changed my view of my career path significantly. I would have not been successful in my overall career without my military experience.

Is there anything from you Vietnam experience you'd like to share?

Yes, I was in Vietnam from March 1967 thru March 1968. During my tour of duty, which was 12 months. Each day was a new threat, I say that because you never knew if you were going to survive that night and live to fight another day.

My most terrifying moment was the 1968 "Tet" Offensive. The 1968 "Tet" Offensive was the only true time that I knew that I was not going to survive and be killed in Vietnam and would not be coming home!!!!

Tell us about receiving the Congressional Veteran Commendation in 2019, and other awards you have received.

The Congressional Veteran Commendation in 2019, was one of my most highlighted awards of my military career. It was a Distinguished Honor for me to accept this award. In my heart, I was not just accepting the award for myself, but for all veterans who served in combat in Vietnam.

I have received numerous awards before the Congressional Commendation. First: Two weeks prior to June 2, 2010, I presented with a Medallion from the Secretary of the Army, thanking me and my unit for our distinguished service in Vietnam and to our country.

On June 2, 2010, I was notified by Congressman Peter Visclosky office that I would be presented with additional citations and medals that were not on my original DD-214. They are: Valorous Unit Citation, Meritorious Unit Citation, RVN Cross of Gallantry w/Palm Device, RVN Civil Action Honor Medal and a third Bronze Star for the 1968 Tet Offensive Military Campaign. Also, my unit, the 199th Light Infantry Brigade, was Awarded the "Presidential Unit Citation".

After leaving Vietnam, I had been awarded the Combat Infantry Men's Badge (CIB), Army ARCOM, Purple Heart and Good Conduct Medal. These were in addition to the so-called standard three-pack of ribbons every Vietnam Veteran received. They are the National Defense Ribbon, Vietnam Service Ribbon and the Vietnam Campaign Ribbon.



Since 1995, I have dedicated my services and help in assuring all veterans receive the benefits they

so rightly deserve. I do offer my expertise on a case-by-case criteria. I have helped numerous veterans and their families receive the benefits they are entitled to and deserve.

Were there any teachers or coaches at Hobart High School who had an influence on your life and/or your career?

On my life, yes! On my career, not so much. The three people at Hobart High School who I believe set the stage for my career goals and future achievements are: Coach Kurth, William Cope and Paul Throne. All three of these individuals set the standards for which I live by today. Honesty, Loyalty, Trust and above all Humility.

What advice do you have for young people today, as they prepare for their careers?

Today, as we all know, we are living in different times than my generation. I chose a path of construction when I came home from Vietnam. I worked my way up from being a timekeeper, surveying engineer, field coordinator and project manager. I retired from the construction industry as a Senior Project Engineer and Assistant VP.

My advice is that you should set out your goals in five-year increments. Don't set your goals too high that they cannot be achieved. If after a five-year period, you have not reached your goals that you have set for yourself, you need to re-evaluate your goals and reset them for the next five years.

Always remember, the best advice I can give any young person is: "If you don't like the world you are living in, only you can change your world."

During the winter, as students attended the old Hobart High School on Fourth Street, sometimes the heating system wouldn't work and it would lose its heating ability. When temperatures dropped to 60 degrees and under in the classroom, teachers would allow students to get their coats and sweaters from their locker and then return to class. On page 5 of the 1958 yearbook, pictures of students are shown in the classroom wearing their winter coats, and snow can be seen out the window covering all of grounds. REPLIES TO DO YOU REMEMBER? The Dust Bowl

From Ken Main (Class of 1966): As a freshman, my dad, Glenn Main, booster club member, built for Coach Deal a lineman charging sled out of rough cut dunnage lumber that came out of rail cars. It was heavy oak. As seven freshmen lineman, you might move the sled on that sandy dirt of the dust bowl. As you progressed and you went through all year weight training with Coach Howell at his health club in Glen Park, seven senior linemen finally got the strength to push that sled around the bowl with Coach Deal riding it. The Brickie football team had the strongest legs in northwest Indiana. BTW – Glenn Main passed away this year, April 11th at the age of 98.5 years old. Here is a link to his obituary.

From Donna Farley Ford (Class of 1974): I grew up in Little Hollywood which was east of the dust bowl. Back then they did not provide bus service because we lived too close to the school so we either walked to the junior high or caught a ride with a parent or older sibling. When we walked we would cut through the dust bowl. Many of my junior high mornings were spent walking through there. I remember the one year that Indiana experiment with the time change. It was so dark still when we had to leave for school and it was pretty scary walking through the bowl that year. And of course you all know that junior high boys took every opportunity to try to scare us to death.
