Alumni Spotlight

David Dickson, Lifelong Educator

Our featured alumnus is David Dickson, Class of 1958, who has been a teacher, a superintendent, university lecturer, teachers' union representative, State Board of Education member, and more. Our interview with David begins on page 2.

Alumni Spotlight (cont.)

Where are you living now, and how do you spend your time these days?

After graduating from Hobart High in 1958, I attended Perkinston Junior College in Perkinston, Mississippi. I received a scholarship for singing in Acapella Choir.

I returned to Indiana and enrolled in Indiana University Northwest. After one semester, I went down to Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana, where I also sang in the acapella choir.

Over a period of time, 1960-1976, I earned a B.S. in Social Studies, an M.S. in Literature, and a Ph.D. in School Administration.

I must thank my wife, whom I married in 1962, for her constant help and support. We have four children and eleven grandchildren.

Could you describe the path from Hobart High School to where you are now?

After graduating with a B.S. degree, I began teaching English at Horace Mann High School in Gary, Indiana. I returned to I.S.U. in 1972 to accept a doctoral fellowship.

In 1975, I accepted the superintendency of Hobart Township Schools. After nine and one half years, I became Superintendent of Hammond schools and was there nineteen and one half years.

During those years, I taught graduate classes for I.U., I.S.U., and was a guest lecturer for Purdue. I also served sixteen years on the Indiana State Board of Education. With a total of forty-two years in education, I retired in 2003.

What motivated you to move from teaching into administration?

As a building representative for the teachers' union, AFT Local 4, I saw many inept principals who had no knowledge of instructional strategy, curriculum development, learning skills, or

teacher development based on training, planning, and classroom lesson plans.

Were there any particular teachers or coaches at Hobart High School who influenced your choice of career?

Mr. Simons, our choir director, was knowledgeable and dedicated to his students. He taught us to see over the horizon and formulated goals and objectives obtained through hard work and perseverance.

I have to say Gladys Anderson taught us the skills that got us through freshman college English. She introduced us to good literature, which directed me toward teaching English.

Do you have any advice for students wanting to go into school administration?

If you are looking toward school administration, first ask these questions:

- Does the community support education?
- Is the school board focused on educational issues, or did they run for the board based on individual petty concerns? Or worse yet, as a springboard into politics?
- Will they set policy and then let the superintendent run the school?

Examine the board's history and past practice to answer these questions.

When applying for a position as superintendent take a close hard look at the school's financial status. The budget in too many ways is a controlling and constraining factor. It affects class size, teacher training, salaries, teacher recruitment, and retention, curriculum change and development, and staying abreast of technology. All facts of the education program are impacted by the financial situation.

Your Brickie Stories: What Do You Remember?

DO YOU REMEMBER? Hobart's Tented Roller Rink: Do you remember the roller rink (and the name of it) built in the early 1940's located off Route 130 between the NIPSCO building and Lo Jac's drive-in? The exterior of the rink consisted of four or five-foot-high concrete block walls. A military surplus hangar tent overlapped the concrete walls, cascaded to the ground, and could be rolled up to allow for air flow. Several times high winds blew the tent off and prevented the skating rink from being used. The rink owners finally decided to close the rink completely in 1947. Many Hobart families enjoyed skating there, and some local students worked there. Dave Leonard was a worker, and his older brother was a skate boy.



This is from the 1922 Aurora, Hobart High School's yearbook. We don't hear this cheer much anymore.



A Handy Guide to the HHSAA Website

Our website is at: www.hobartalumni.org. Most of the information on the site is available to you without registering, but to see a classmate's profile, you need to register with an email address and a password. Also, to see the list of Life Members of the HHS Alumni Association, you need to be registered. Here is a short tour. These screen shots are from a smartphone, so if you have a laptop or desktop, the screen may be laid out a little differently, but everything should still be there and easy to find.



#1: This is what the home page looks like when you first arrive. In the gold bar, you'll see two icons, the Head icon and the Menu icon. If you are not a registered user, these are the only two icons you will see. If you tap (or click) the Head icon, you will be able to log in.



#2: This is the login screen, where you enter your email address (which is your username) and your password. If you would like to join the website, click Join Here, and you will be guided through the steps. Note that joining the website is free. To join the HHS Alumni Association, scroll all the way to the bottom and look for Donate.




#3: After you log in, you will see two more icons. The envelope is for the Message Center, and the bell is for Notifications.




#4: In the Message

Handy Guide to the HHSAA Website (continued)



#5: The Head icon now has a drop-down list, which contains many items:

- Notify Me: change preferences, like birthday notifications
- Message Center: same as the envelope icon
- Edit Contact Info: this is where you can change the email address you want to use for your username. You can also change your address, phone number, and even your name (for example, if you get married)
- Edit Profile: this is where you can post pictures, videos, and information about your spouse or partner, kids and grandkids, your occupation, your school story, your military experience, and where you can block the public and search engines from accessing your profile (highly recommended).
- Post Announcements: these have to be approved by the webmaster, just to prevent spamming and advertising.
- Change Password: you can change your own password here, but if you forget yours, there is a Forgot Password link on the login screen.
- Log Out: for privacy and security, we recommend that you log out after each session.



#6: The Menu icon lets you visit any of our feature pages.

- Classmate Profiles: search for a classmate or alum, living or deceased. Everyone can read obituaries, but you need to be registered to see the profile for a living classmate.
- Teacher Profiles: teachers don't have a class year unless they graduated from Hobart. You'll find teachers and staff listed in this section.
- HHSAA Newsletters: every one of our newsletters, going all the way back to 2011, can be accessed here. The most recent issue is listed first.
- Alumni Spotlight Archive: find the newsletter by the name of the Alumni Spotlight feature. Nearly all of our issues have this feature.
- HHS Yearbooks Online: the Lake County Public Library digitized most (but not all) of the HHS yearbooks since 1908. Inside each one, you can search for anyone by typing their name.
- Recent Obituaries: listed with most recent entries first and separated by month, obituaries are listed here, with a link to the original source.
- In Memory: select the graduating year, and the list of deceased class members will be listed by year deceased or alphabetically.
- Class Reunions: all upcoming class reunions that we know about are listed here, including contact information. They are listed in order of the event's occurrence. (You can send class reunion info to us at: info@hobartalumni.org.)
- FAQ Page: frequently-asked questions about the website.
- Class Website Links: if your class has its own website, we'll be happy to include your link here.
- What Was Playing? a list of the most popular songs playing during your graduation year, from 2016 all the way back to 1900, with links to the songs themselves! The list was compiled by Jennifer Eastwood Davis, Class of 1962.
- HHS Alumni Association: information about the HHS Alumni Association.
- HHSAA Life Members: a list of all life members of the HHSAA (you must be registered).
- Contact Us: an easy way to send the webmaster a message, including how to get your name onto your class roster if it is not there.
- Home Page: this takes you back to the main page of the website.
