Meet Your HHSAA Board!

For the next few issues of *The Brick and Mortar Board*, we will be interviewing ourselves! We'll give you a chance to get to know the people on the Board of Directors of the Hobart High School Alumni Association. We'll start off with the board President, Paul Addison, and the Treasurer, Debra Opolski. Paul chose to use the traditional interview format, while Debra's story is in narrative form.

Paul Addison, HHSAA Board President

What are you up to these days, and how do you keep busy?

I live in West Lafayette, Indiana, and I just retired in May after 30 years of teaching computer programming at Ivy Tech Community College in Lafayette. So, I'm not quite as busy as before, but I play trombone or piano in three bands (the community band, a Dixieland band, and a swing band), I direct musicals at the local community theater, and I lead our church choir and Praise Team.

And I'm happy to still be involved with the Hobart High School Alumni Association, which Debra Broker Opolski and I helped to establish in 2010.

My wife Jan and I will celebrate our 44th anniversary in October. We have two kids, Mark and Rachel, and five grandkids, Guy, Louis, Olivia, Emma, and Izzy. Mark and the boys live in Japan, and Rachel and the girls live in Virginia.

Could you trace your path from Hobart High School to now?

I grew up with the Class of 1970, but in my junior year I discovered that if I took a government class in summer school, I would technically have enough credits to graduate, so I took advantage of that and started at Indiana University in the fall of 1969. However, I switched majors from mathematics to music education in my second year, and it took me five years to graduate from IU, so I guess it all evened out.

After college, I took a job teaching junior high band in Lafayette. Coming from IU, I didn't think I would stay very long, but here I am. The band directing job only lasted a couple of years, but I have continued to play and direct music ever since that time.

I started taking computer programming classes at Purdue University. In the 1970s, if you could program, you could get a job without a degree in the field, although I did eventually get a Master's degree in Educational Computing at Purdue. I worked in information technology (it was called data processing at the time) at the Purdue Libraries, where I met my wife Jan, and then at Great Lakes Chemical Corporation, before starting my teaching career at Ivy Tech. I also worked briefly as the K-12 Outreach Coordinator for the Purdue Computer Science Department.

Were there any teachers or coaches at Hobart who had an influence on your life?

There were many, especially in my sophomore and junior year: Ray Grivetti and Herman Matlock, who showed me that music can be fun; Boyd Scarborough, who made history come alive; Stanley Senderak, who helped me connect mathematics with the real world; Mike Howard, who helped me think and write creatively; and Brian Reed, who helped me to think logically.



But the person who had the most influence on me at Hobart was Paul Throne. I didn't have him as a teacher, but

he was my guidance counselor in junior high, and coach when Keith Addison and I shared the jobs of manager and statistician for the junior high track team. He showed me by example how to treat and respect people. He was on the founding board of the Hobart High School Alumni Association, and we kept in touch frequently until he passed away earlier this year.


Your Brickie Stories: What Do You Remember?

Special Football Shoes

From Lyle "Lightshoe" Hatten, Class of 1958: This story takes place in the 1957 football season. Practice under Coach Deal started the beginning of August before school began. About two weeks before our season's first game Coach Deal had a routine where team members would receive new game shoes, and last year's game shoes would be used for practice. Team players would be sent to Mitchell's Sporting Goods to be fitted for shoes, and then take the new shoes back to the locker room. While being sized up for my new shoes at Mitchell's the salesperson showed me a pair of expensive lightweight leather shoes that the coach authorized for his running backs only. As a tackle lineman I thought "wow!" and I left the shoe store with a pair of new lightweight shoes under my arm.

When starting the next dust bowl practice, I thought I might be told to return the new shoes, but it didn't happen. At practices Coach Deal always started out with a little pep talk and then released everyone to go to their practice areas. One day as he completed his pep talk, he blurted out "Team, we have a member who thinks he should be a running back. Hatten, go work out with the backs." Checking with our back coach I found we were having tackling practice. As I ran the ball and hit into the linemen I was taken to the ground. "Ouch!" Thirty to forty minutes passed, and I ran the ball five or six times. The coach took me aside and said "Good practice runs. Now return to your line coach." When I returned, my line coach said with a smile, "Welcome home. Sorry you didn't make it." My teammates welcomed me also by harassing me throughout the remaining practices.

At our first home game I started at end and the end coach laughed and said to me "Go get 'em, 'Lightshoe'." Well, we beat Whiting High and the assistant coaches would now and then laughingly call me 'Lightshoe' for the rest of the season. Coach Deal never hit me up about the special shoes until the end of the season. He told me that coaches look for fun things and he used my shoes as one of them. He never let me forget this incident throughout his years.



A Dust Bowl Story

It's true that our Brickies have spirit. The spirit was always with our team in practice and games. This story takes place in the summer of '56 while in an early Dust Bowl practice under Coach Deal and staff who were having us run scrimmage plays. As my scrimmage team broke huddle and lined up on the ball in our line stance, my right hand sank down into the Dust Bowl sandy loam hitting a hard rock. Then, for some reason, I grabbed the rock in my fist just as the play started. Soon after the play's completion, I looked at the rock to find it was an arrowhead. I finished the morning's practice, carrying the arrowhead in my hand, and took it home to show my parents. The incident strongly made me think that our practice Dust Bowl wooded area must have had early Native Americans crossing it with bows and arrows. I still have the arrowhead as of today.
