We are reaching out to current and retired teachers of Hobart High School to join our website. We have always considered faculty and staff of Hobart schools to be alumni, as well as students who attended Hobart schools at any time. You don't have to be a paying member of the Hobart High School Alumni Association to register for free on our website. If you haven't already joined, here's how:

- Go to the website, <u>www.hobartalumni.org</u>, and select Current and Retired Teachers.
- If you find your name, click the link to go to the JOIN HERE page. In addition to your preferred email address, you just need to select a password. We also invite you to share profile information, such as the years you taught at Hobart, what subjects you taught, and anything else you'd like to share with other Hobart alumni.
- If you do NOT find your name, click on the <u>Contact Us</u> link, enter your name and email address, then enter "Teacher: please add me" as the subject. You can skip Regarding Year, and the message is optional. Send it, and we'll add your name to the Current and Retired Teachers page, and we will email you so that you know you can register on the website.

The All Teachers page includes teachers who are deceased, but the Current and Retired Teachers page is just for living teachers, past and present. Some have already joined, but we want you to know you are ALL invited. It's an easy way to find out what alumni are doing, and a great way to renew old friendships!

Your Brickie Stories: What Do You Remember?

A High School Student on the Payroll

In 1956, as a Hobart High Sophomore, I started a job at school while being on study hall time. This job was to empty trash cans from the offices and teachers' lounge, and take the trash to the basement janitorial room for drop-off. I also refilled the teachers' lounge soda machine and organized empty bottles for pickup by the delivery man. In the teachers' lounge, occasionally a teacher would catch me and give me extra trash to dispose of, which led me to have a conversation with them, and get to know many of the teachers better.

When taking the trash to the basement, I would walk the school halls, visit with the hall guards and stop by the home ec room. There the home ec students would pass me goodies they had made. After that, I would visit the cheerleaders during practice; however, the girls always confiscated some of my goodies from home ec. This forced me to alter my route and visit the home ec room last, after which I would return to Study Hall. Some Study Hall teachers also would take a goodie or two (this was good p.r. for me).

When payroll day arrived, I observed the male teachers getting a check out of their mailbox and some would walk around the rest of the day with this check showing out of their shirt pockets. As I saw this, on payday I made sure to wear a shirt with a pocket so I could also walk around with my check sticking out of my shirt pocket. Some teachers thought I was teasing them (and I was!).

Our principal, Mr. Moody, offered me this job. I believe this was because several years before, as a "middleschooler" I helped him and his family move into their home. It was a cold winter day and nobody in his family knew how to build a coal fire in their furnace. I showed them how, and his family really appreciated this.

This job ended in 1958, as the school office advised me that students weren't allowed to work during the school year, but only in the summer.
