

Could you describe your life and career path from Hobart High School until now?

I graduated from Indiana University B.S. 1979... M.S. 1986...Played football at IU for all 4 years. Was a Graduate Assistant Football Coach at Indiana in 1979...was Assistant Football Coach at Wabash College 1980-1983...also Head Baseball Coach at Wabash College in 1983...Assistant Football Coach Marshall University 1984-1985...Assistant Football Coach Kansas State University 1986-1988...Assistant Football Coach Virginia Military Institute 1989-1990...Assistant Football Coach Rutgers University 1991-1995...Assistant Football Coach Indiana University 1996-2000...Assistant Director of Indiana University Varsity Club 2001-2007...Assistant Athletic Director of Football Operations Indiana University 2008-2013... Assistant Athletic Director for Alumni Relations 2014-to present.

I am married for 30 years to my wife Patty...also an IU graduate...we have 2 children who are both IU graduates... Carrie 28 and Casey 24...we have 2 grandchildren... Eleanore who is 2 and a grandson Eli who was born a month ago.

Tell us about your father and brother, and how your family influenced your choice of a career.

Obviously my Dad was the major influence on my career. I grew up the son of the "Father of Hobart Football". I wanted to be a Coach like he was. My

Mom was also a teacher, first at Gary Froebel High School and then at Hobart. So educators were a huge part of our family. I grew up where the dominant male figures in my life were my dad and my brother Mike. I followed in their footsteps not only as football players at Indiana University, but also in the coaching and education profession. It's funny that my Dad retired as Head Football Coach at Hobart to become the principal...and I have worked as an administrator at Indiana University for the past 15 years.

Were there other people at Hobart, like teachers and coaches or other adults, who made a special impression on you as you were growing up?

So many people! When you grow up the son of Russ and Eleanore Deal, you live your life in a little bit of a fish bowl. I had excellent teachers and coaches in Junior High and High School (many of them played or coached with my Dad)...Paul Throne, Jackie Rogers, Judy Lopez, Anita Sark, Tom Wuchner, Dwight Mathis, Jim Huminsky, John Carlson...my coaches...Don Howell, Tom Kerr, Bill Cope, Jerry Hicks, Steve Balash, Jim Lichtenberger, Tom Workman, Moe Rhody...probably left someone out and I apologize for that.

What advice would you give to Hobart High School students about coaching and directing athletics?

It is a great profession. I hear from guys I coached at Wabash College (when I was only a few years older than them) and Rutgers University my last place before IU...I was at Rutgers 5 years and grew very close to those guys...20 of them came to see



me at the Rutgers vs. IU game in New Jersey last fall...it was very special and very emotional for me...that is why you coach and teach...it is all about the relationships.

Happy 5th Birthday to Us! (A Message from the President)

The Hobart High School Alumni Association celebrates its fifth birthday on July 17. It was on July 17, 2010, that Debra Broker Opolski and I filed the Articles of Incorporation with the Indiana Secretary of State. A week before that, on July 10, a small group of Hobart alumni met at a park bench under a tree at Festival Park and decided to form the Hobart High School Alumni Association, Inc.

During that first year, our main focus was to plan and advertise the first BrickieFest, held in Brickie Bowl on July 30, 2011. Those of you who attended will remember that it was about 95 degrees in the shade, and we were not in the shade! Still, over 1600 people



attended, many of whom became paying members of the HHSAA. Since then, we have had fall gettogethers at Festival Park, Deep River County Park, and Veterans Memorial Park. Since 2013, they have been held (and will continue to be held) on the Saturday of Homecoming weekend. This year's Homecoming Picnic is at Festival Park, from 12 noon to 3 pm. We will be serving hot dogs, brats and bottled water, all free of charge.

We decided early on that registering on our website, www.hobartalumni.org, would be free, and that alumni can use the website to contact each other, publicize their class reunions, and find the latest news about the Alumni Association and its activities. We also decided to make our newsletters available for free on the website. The newsletter is published about six times a year. Since June 2012, each issue has featured an "Alumni Spotlight", in which we talk with a Hobart High School graduate who has gone on to an interesting career. So why do we also have a paid membership option? It's because our mission is to support Hobart High School as well as the alumni. In our first five years, we have awarded eight scholarships to graduating high school seniors, and one professional development grant to a Hobart teacher. As alumni of Hobart High School, the Alumni Association gives back to the school that gave us our own start, and we continue to watch talented young men and women of character leave Hobart High School to make their marks on the world.

The Hobart High School Principal has always been a member of our board. David Spitzer helped us get our start during our first year, and Brent Martinson has been a tremendous support to us since then. We welcome new Hobart High School Principal Angela Patrick, who will become a member of our board when school starts this fall. I'd like to thank all our board members, past and present, especially Coach Paul Throne, for their loyalty, enthusiasm, creative ideas and hard work since the beginning. I'd also like to thank all of you alumni for your support of the Hobart High School Alumni Association during these first five years. Here's to many more!


