Greg Heuer, Clarinetist and Woodworker

Our *Alumni Spotlight* this issue is on Greg Heuer, Class of 1965. Greg played in the band program at Hobart High School started his career as a music educator. Then his career took a turn, and he has been the National Director at the Architectural Woodwork Institute in Washington, DC until his retirement last year.


Our interview with Greg starts here.

Where are you living now and what are you doing these days?

My wife, Linda Gamble, and I live on the lea side of the Blue Ridge of central Virginia in a small rural community between Charlottesville and Lynchburg. We are both retired from formal

occupations, and still volunteer with a number of groups. Linda continues teaching selected voice and piano students, as she has done for 45 years. While we have the health and energy we are traveling everywhere we can pulling our Airstream behind us. Next year, our 50th anniversary, we will take the Queen Mary II to Europe to celebrate in Paris and London.

What were your experiences with the Hobart bands when you were in school?

Our class was fortunate to have some of the best Conductors. As a result we small-town kids experienced a wide range of fine music, including classics, popular, show tunes, and band standards. The most long lasting memories are those of the "bonding" between bandsmen of that era. We toured to other schools and broadened our world view as a result. Personally I was selected to serve as Drum Major for the Marching Bands, both in Jr. High and High School. I got my training at Drum Major Camp in Indiana, with over a 100 aspiring DMs from all over the midwest. Mr. Rogers appointed me student conductor of the HS Band my senior year. All of this experience as helped me over the years, and I would not have had it except for Band.

Who are some of the classmates you remember, or have kept in touch with over the years?

Because our family moved away from Hobart during my first year of college, I never "came home" to visit. I lost track of many of my friends and, in the era before social media, had no clever way to reconnect. Over the years both Sherman Wilcox and David Metz have been the brothers I never had, and we've stayed in touch.

Bill Keller, Jerry Dodgson and I were privileged to go to Philmont Scout Camp in 1961 for leadership training. Skills I learned in Scouting have shaped my life.

After 50 years apart I've recently reconnected with Nancy Walker and Mary (Ratliff) Higbee, one on each coast of the USA. Sharing both memories and life events with these folks makes me smile.

Could you trace your path from Hobart High School to where you are now?



I went to the University of Michigan to study Band with William D. Revelli. How could I do

otherwise, coming from Hobart, eh? Once again, I was fortunate to arrive in the glory days of the UM Band program. The faculty was made up of the musical stars from the Chicago Symphony, the best talent in America attracted by the premier music school in the Midwest.

Graduating in 1969, I was recruited by Belleville High School, between Ann Arbor and Detroit, as Conductor of Bands. Like HHS, BHS Bands were founded in the late 1920s. The

director/founder was Nicholas Falcone, then the conductor of bands at the Univ. of Michigan. Dr. Revelli replaced Dr. Falcone at UM in 1936-37. I became Chairman of the Music Dept. at BHS, leaving in 1973 to join Linda in working for the Harrah family in Reno, NV. I was musical director for the Junior Light Opera and American Stage Festival in Reno for three years.

How did you get involved with woodworking, and what are you doing with it lately?

I got "back to the bench" in late 1976 when my Dad, running his woodworking shop in Arlington, IL, asked me to come back to help. I had grown up next to Dad at the workbench. His hobby had gotten out of hand as we turned it in to a full-fledged Chicagoland architectural woodwork manufacturing firm, based in Schaumburg. We joined the local Chapter of the Architectural Woodwork Institute, and I became an officer. Because I love to teach, I helped educate Chicagoland architects in the use of fine woodwork on their projects.

This brought me to the attention of the National Architectural Woodwork Institute (AWI) leadership. I was recruited to join the Washington, DC, office of the professional staff of AWI in 1987. We moved to Virginia, and I worked at AWI until retirement in 2016. As Technical Director, I travelled all over the US and Canada teaching courses in woodworking and served as editor of three books on woodwork standards over 20 years.

My small (20×40) shop on the lower level of our home is always buzzing with some sort of project, and smells refreshingly of cut pine and sawdust.

What is the Airstream Band, and how did you get involved with that?

50+ years later I'm still playing the clarinet and tenor sax, both in a small local orchestra and the Annual Airstream International Band. The Airstream Band gathers at locations all over the USA, arriving before the annual convention for "band week" during which we prepare the music for a number of performances at the convention. There will be 700+ Airstreams in Salem, Oregon, this year at the 61st annual rally. This year we'll play an arrangement of Hollywood themes arranged by a

classmate of mine at the U of M, John Higgins. We hope to perform for some good crowds.

Did any teachers or other people in the Hobart schools have a particular influence on your life?

Yes, my mind races back to Jr. High with Robert Webb teaching me clarinet and Al Spriester conducting the Band. My inspiration to become a band director rests with Alvin Rogers and the longstanding traditions of excellence in

the HHS Bands. From a personal development standpoint my best teacher was Mr. Scarborough. He instilled a love of history and taught me how to take notes effectively in outline form. I have used those skills every day since, in both my personal and professional life.

What advice would you give to high school students today for planning their careers?

Know the difference between a career and a job. Pursue something you love until you don't. Don't be afraid to work with your hands as well as your mind. Not everyone is cut out for college, explore trade schools, learn a portable craft. Make yourself indispensable until you're 60 by asking, "How can I help? What's next?" Then, make yourself replaceable by training the next generation to take over your career spot. Finally, treat the people you work for, the people you teach, and the people who work for you as ladies and gentlemen. Honor them and they will return the favor.

John's talk was titled "The Mattix/Hobart Legacy". He talked about his football experience at Hobart High School, and his place in the well-known Mattix family. He talked about how he always felt "competent, not extraordinary", and yet, as Billy Joel once said, in a world of incompetence, that makes you extraordinary. He related experiences in which he and others could hear the voices of teachers and coaches telling him to be prepared, try again and try harder, and that sometimes you have to call another play.
