He is a 17-year member of the Hobart Police Department (following in his father's footsteps), and was recently elected to the Board of Hobart Township. Ethan Smith, Class of 2009

Ethan Smith, HHS Alumnus, Indy Police Officer

Our Alumni Spotlight this month is on Ethan Smith, Class of 2009, who is now an Indianapolis police officer and First Lieutenant in the Army National Guard. Ethan was recently featured in the news for helping push a man whose wheelchair broke down for several city blocks in Indianapolis. (See our website for the story.)

The interview begins here:

What is your job, and what does it consist of?

I am a Police Officer with the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department, as well as a 1st Lieutenant in the National Guard. My job of a Police Officer for IMPD consists of the normal duties of a Police Officer. Those duties are to serve and protect the citizens of Indianapolis, Indiana. As a 1st Lieutenant Signal Officer in the National Guard, I lead the Signal Corps, which is responsible for the Army's entire system of communication. Officers plan and execute all aspects of communication on a mission and are critical to the Army's continued success. I am being deployed to Kuwait the 1st week of June this year, and this will be my 1st deployment, which will be a 9-month deployment.

Could you tell us a little about your family life?

My parents are David and Stacey Smith, my sister and brother are Saylem, and Easton. My parents and siblings live in Hobart, and I live in Indianapolis. Growing up, I was an only child for the first 12 years of my life, until I was blessed with my sister and brother. I grew up with parents that encouraged me to try everything at least once, whether it was sports or any other activity. My parents taught me to always have goals and never be afraid to fail, and they convinced me that hard work always pays off.

We read the story of how you pushed a man whose wheelchair had broken down. Do you have a lot of non-crime, non-accident situations to deal with in your job?

As a Police Officer we are always dealing with noncrime issues, for example, an elder husband's wife was getting tires put on their car and the husband was not able to reach his wife for quite a while. He called into the Police Department, where I received the run to assist him. I went to his house, got his information, and I decided to try and find his wife for him. I was able to locate her at a different tire shop, where she was waiting for them to complete her car. I went back to the gentlemen's house to let him know she went to an entirely different tire place then they had planned and that she was okay, and that she would be home shortly. We deal with non-crime issues every day, whether it is defusing argument amounts neighbors or family member or the elderly needing someone to talk to.

Could you trace your path from Hobart High School to where you are now?

I graduated Hobart High School in 2009, and went on to Saint Joseph College, where I spent a semester and then transferred to Indiana Northwest. From there, I transferred to Indiana University Bloomington. My junior year at IU, I took a semester off and went to Basic and Infantry Training at Fort Benning, Georgia. After completing the Army training, I went back to IU to finish. I graduated in 2015 with a degree in Criminal Justice, and I also graduated Indiana University ROTC program. Following graduation, I was offered a position as a Patrol Officer with IMPD, where after being hired I attended their 48-week Police Academy Training and Field Training, which I graduated from in 2016.

Were there any particular teachers, coaches or experiences at Hobart High School, or in Hobart growing up, that had a strong influence on you?

I am sorry to say, but there were no coaches or teachers, or community that influenced me to get where I am today. The most important influences in my life are my parents. They were the ones that supported me, and always gave me the tools I needed to be successful. They always encouraged me to set goals, and once they were reached, to set new ones. I can honestly say, without my parents, I would not be where I am today.

Do you have any advice for students today who might be considering a career in law enforcement?

I encourage those who want to become Police Officers, but they need to realize it is a job that requires self-discipline, mental strength, physical strength, and the willingness to protect and serve their community. There is not a job in the world that is more rewarding then being a Police Officer.
