Grayce Roach, Hobart HS Basketball Standout, Now Head Girls BB Coach at Westville

Our Alumni Spotlight this month is on Grayce Roach, 2014 graduate of Hobart High School, who excelled in basketball at Hobart and at IU Northwest. She is now the Head Girls Basketball Coach at Westville High School.

Where do you live, and what are you doing now?

I currently live in Michigan City where I am eagerly waiting for the school year to begin. This May I graduated and received my Master's in Public Administration from IU Northwest and since then, I have been enjoying my time off by soaking up the sun, catching up with friends, and spending time with my dogs.

Could you trace the path from when you graduated from Hobart High School until now?

Upon my graduation from Hobart High School in 2014, I chose to attend IU Northwest, where I studied Communication and played basketball for the Lady RedHawks. In 2018, I graduated and received a B.A. in Communication with Distinct Honor; however, during my senior year, I had to red

shirt for basketball due to a sports injury, leaving me with one extra year of eligibility. Therefore, I chose to return back to IU Northwest, fall 2018, to pursue a Master's in Public Administration while completing my final season as a Lady RedHawk. During that season (2018-2019), I became an All-American and had a realization that I was meant to work in the Athletic Industry, so for my last year of my MPA program, I was the Head Women's Golf Coach at IU Northwest, as well as, the Graduate Assistant for Women's Basketball. Once I finished my studies this past Spring, I was hired at Westville High School to be a Physical Education Teacher and the Head Girls Basketball Coach. Although my degrees are not in education, I was able to fulfill this career by obtaining an Advanced Teaching License. I chose this path to get my foot in the door and hopefully help my dream of becoming an Athletic Director.

What sports and activities did you participate in at Hohart?


During High School, I participated in Varsity Basketball, Varsity Volleyball, National Honors Society and DECA.


